The municipal council intends to adopt Fire Department Pumper Truck Loan Authorization Bylaw 1403. The purpose of the bylaw is to borrow an amount not to exceed \$400,000.00 (four hundred thousand dollars) to finance the cost of purchasing a pumper truck for the Oliver Fire Department. The amount will be repaid over a period not to exceed 20 (twenty) years.

A copy of Fire Department Pumper Truck Loan Authorization Bylaw 1403 and a report is available at the Town of Oliver during normal business hours and the website at www.oliver.ca > What's Happening.

Elector Eligibility

In order to sign an elector response form in relation to the alternative approval process, a person must either be a resident elector or a non-resident property elector.

Resident Elector:

An individual who is entitled to sign an elector response form during an APP by virtue of **living in Oliver**. When signing an elector response form, a resident elector must:

- Be 18 years of age or older
- Be a Canadian Citizen
- Have lived in BC for at least 6 months
- Have lived in Oliver for at least 30 days; and
- Not be disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from voting in a local election, or be otherwise disqualified by law.

Non-Resident Elector:

An individual who does not live in Oliver and who is entitled to sign an elector response form during an AAP by virtue of **owning property in Oliver**. When signing an elector response form, a non-resident elector must:

- Be 18 years of age or older
- Be a Canadian Citizen
- Have lived in BC for at least 6 months
- Have owned property in Oliver for at least 30 days; and
- Not be disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from voting in a local election, or be otherwise disqualified by law.

Note:

Only one non-resident property elector may sign an elector response form per property, regardless of how many people own the property; and, that the owner must have the written consent of a majority of the other property owner(s) to sign the response form on their behalf. **Property owned in whole or in part by a corporation does NOT qualify under the non-resident elector provisions.**
